The Special Foundation was established to address one of Nigeria's most pressing challenges — the high number of out-of-school children, driven largely by poverty and lack of access to quality education.

With over 20 million children currently out of school in Nigeria, we are working to bridge the gap by providing underserved children with the knowledge, skills, and opportunities they need to thrive. We believe that for Africa to realise the full potential of its population, stakeholders must play an active role in shaping an inclusive and educated future.

By the year 2030, our objective is to have facilitated access to quality education for at least 100,000 children across Africa through our foundation.

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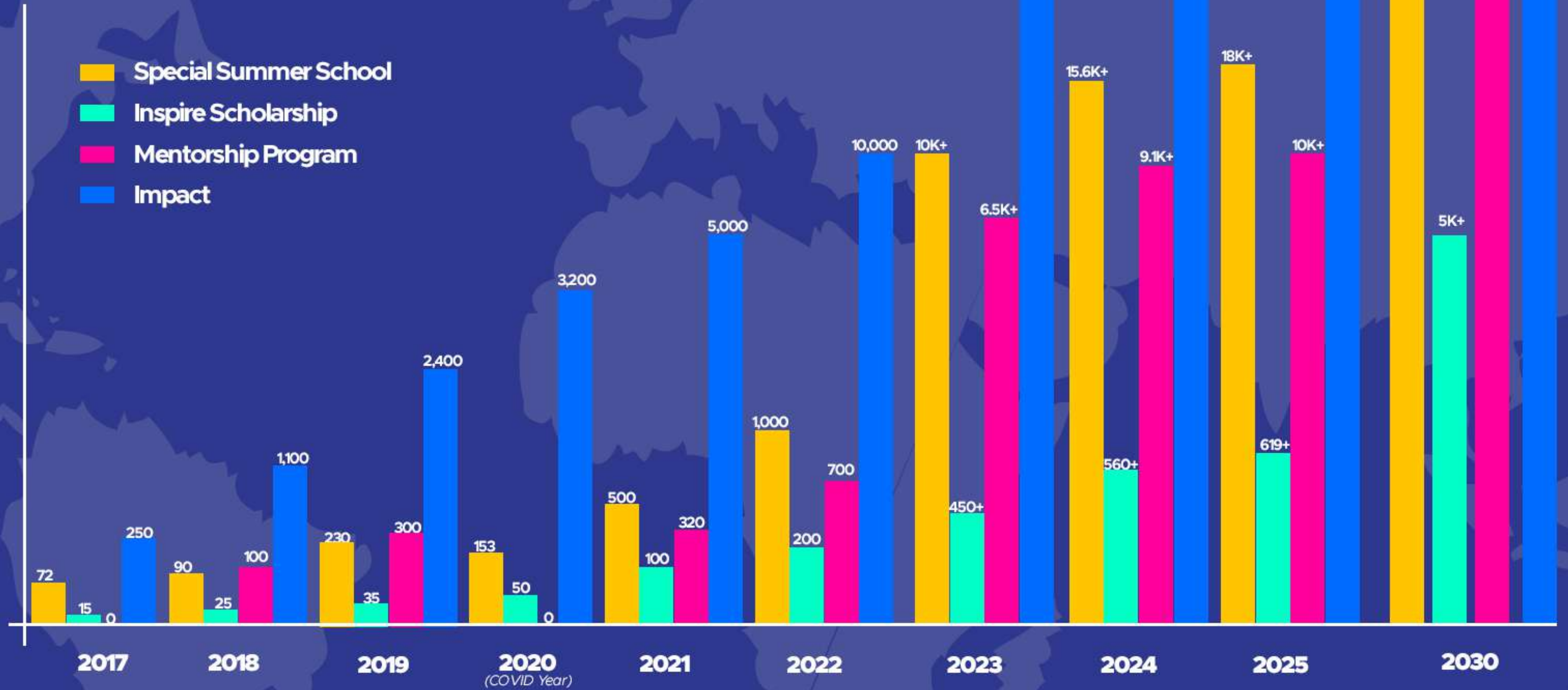

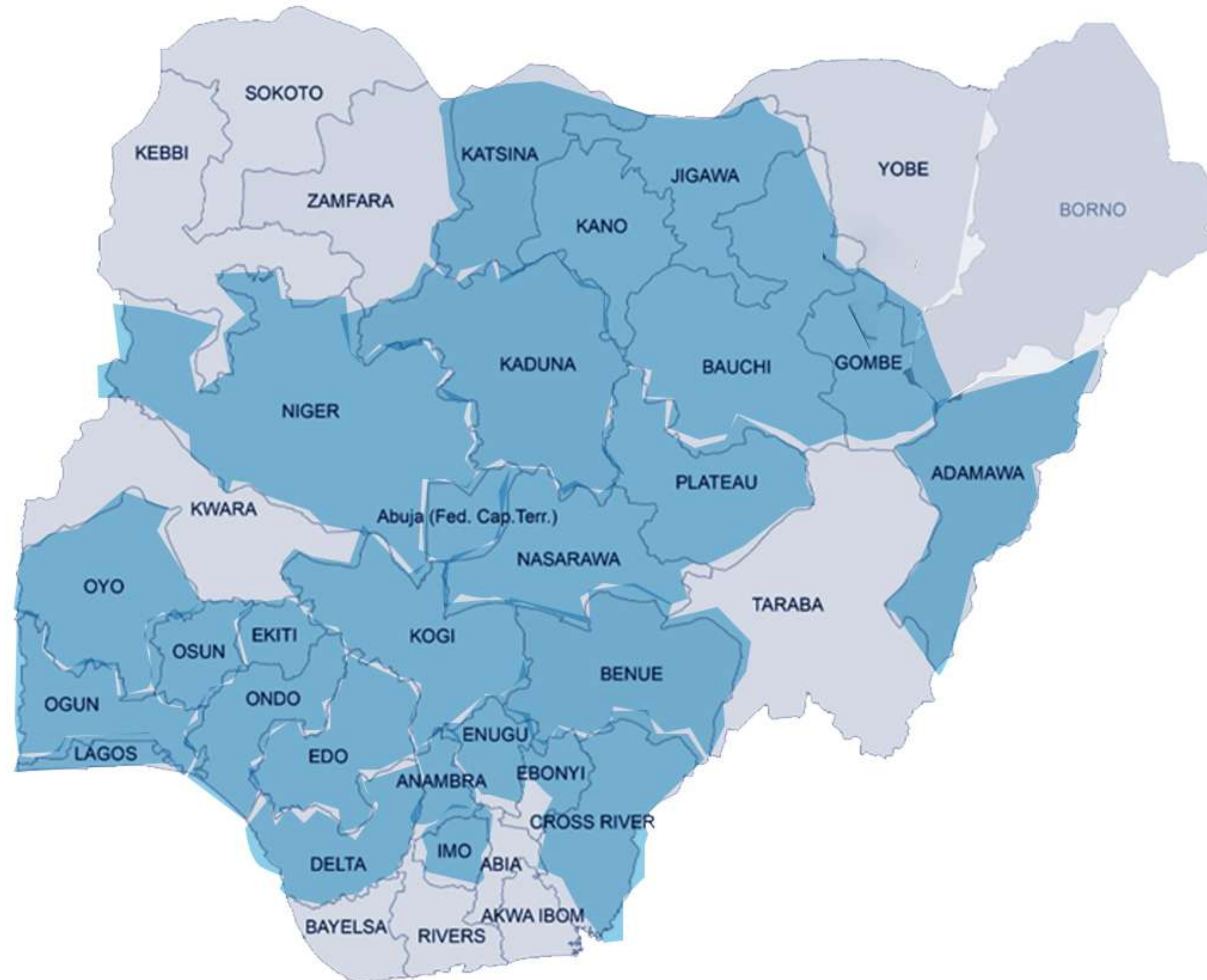

## INSPIRE SCHOLARSHIP

Created to support children from low-income families, orphans, and those who have lost a breadwinner, the Inspire Scholarship provides access to quality education for primary and secondary school students, ensuring no child's future is defined by their circumstances.

## SPECIAL SCHOLARSHIP

A merit-based scholarship that identifies and supports gifted students under 21, providing access to local tertiary education and a pathway to leadership through academic excellence.

## SPECIAL SUMMER SCHOOL

A free, annual summer program that equips in-school and out-of-school children with practical skills like craftsmanship, mental math, creative writing, ICT, and public speaking, building confidence and competence beyond the classroom.



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## SCHOOL BUILD PROGRAM

An infrastructure-driven initiative committed to building and renovating schools, ensuring more children learn in safe, dignified, and inspiring environments.

## MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

A mentorship initiative connecting young minds with professionals across industries, offering guidance, real-world insight, and leadership development for the next generation.

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# INSPIRE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This program was created to provide scholarships for children of low-income earners, orphaned children, and families that have lost a breadwinner. The initiative focuses on primary and secondary school students.

We are committed to supporting and sponsoring the educational needs of children under this scholarship. This scholarship covers the cost of tuition, books, stationery, and other necessary materials for school.

Join us in our fight to reduce the number of out-of-school children and the level of illiteracy, poverty, and bad leadership by equipping the next generation with quality education. It costs about ₦300,000 to sponsor a child for a year.

By investing in bright minds, this program helps build the next generation of changemakers, students who are not only succeeding in their fields but are also committed to giving back.



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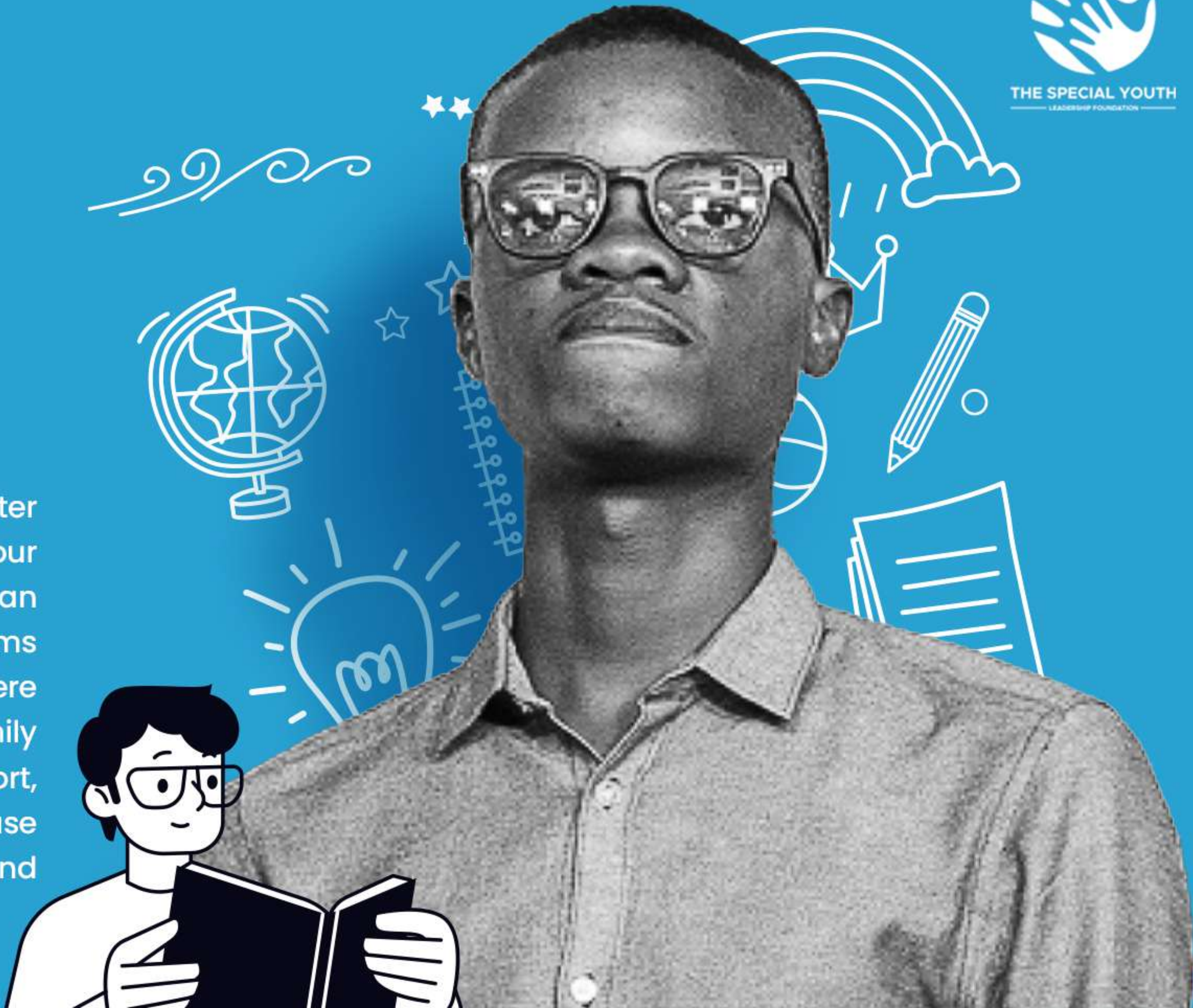
# MEET ONE OF OUR SPECIAL SCHOLARS

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# SPECIAL SUMMER SCHOOL

The Summer School Program is a 4-6 week intensive program that provides hands-on learning and practical skill-building in areas such as soap making, tailoring, coding, catering, leadership, and entrepreneurship for children across primary and secondary school levels. Fully funded by the Foundation and its partners, the 2024 edition reached over 5,000 children, equipping them with lifelong skills while fostering creativity, teamwork, and self-confidence.

# SCHOOL BUILD PROGRAM

Many schools lack the infrastructure needed for effective learning. Research shows that most public schools fall short of the recommended standards for safe, supportive learning environments.

Our School Build Program tackles this by constructing and renovating resilient educational facilities, helping students thrive in spaces designed for growth.

Schools are selected through trusted partner referrals. So far, we've improved over 14 schools, impacting over 7,500 students.

Each center is funded with ₦7,000,000, fully covered by the Foundation and partners.

# HOPE PRIMARY SCHOOL, IKOYI

At Hope Primary School in Ikoyi, we led a major renovation project to revive the school's infrastructure and learning environment. This included the full upgrade of the Oasis Library, renovation of classroom blocks and the staffroom, as well as the installation of solar panels and ceiling fans to improve comfort and energy access.

We also brought life and creativity to the school through vibrant mural paintings, alongside providing books, furniture, and learning resources. These changes were designed not just to improve academics, but to restore pride and possibility in a space that serves hundreds of children.

Today, Hope Primary is a transformed learning hub and a model for what's possible in public education **impacting over 800 lives**. The project was featured on Channels TV and continues to inspire hope in the community, calling for more partnerships to expand this impact nationwide.

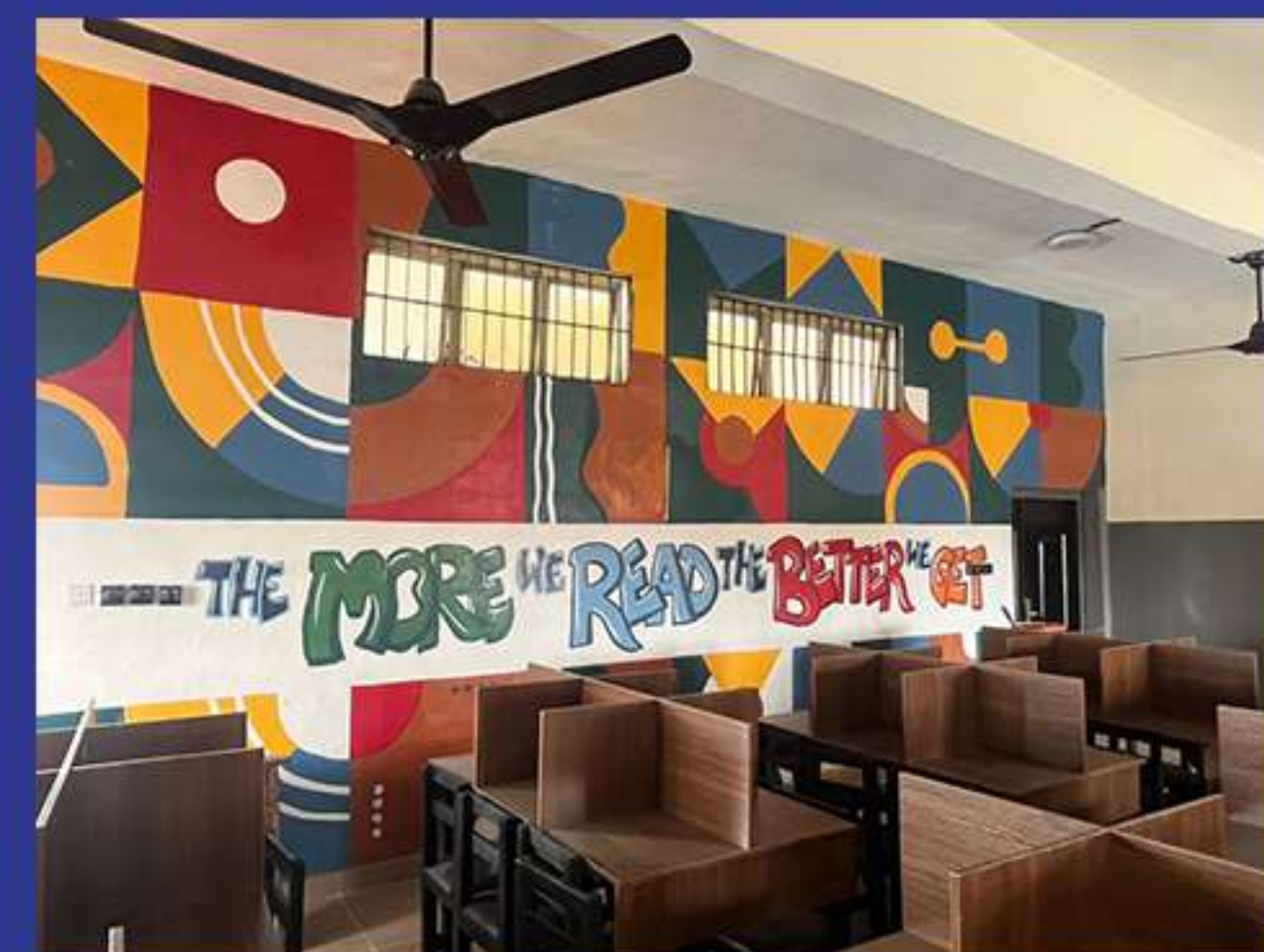
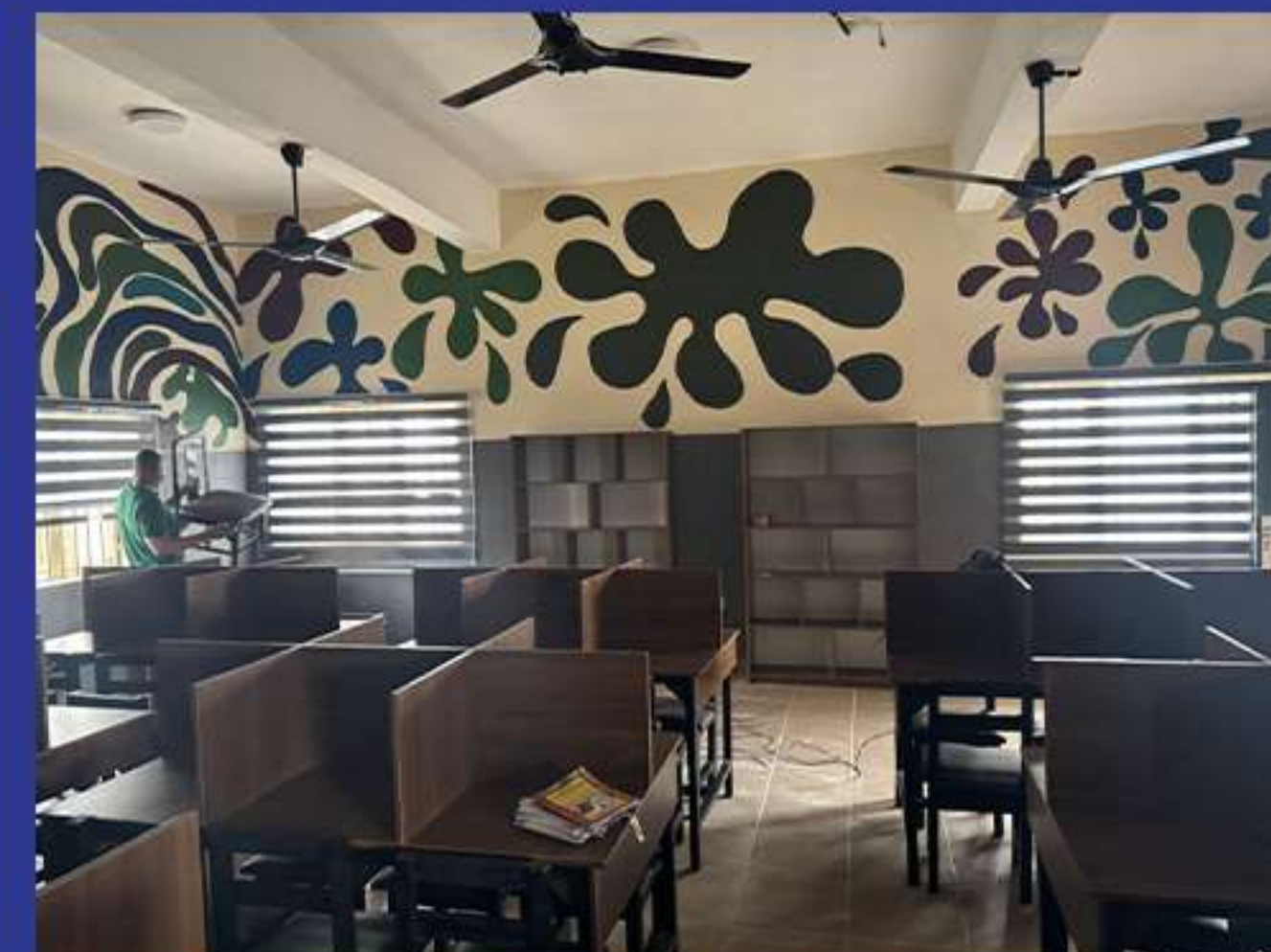

We recently completed the full renovation of the school library at St. Francis Junior Grammar School, Iwaya-Yaba. Once a forgotten space, it is now a vibrant hub for learning, curiosity, and imagination. With new shelves, books, furniture, and muraled bright walls, students finally have a safe, inspiring place to read, study, and dream.

Impacting over 1700 lives, this library is more than a renovation. It's a promise to every child: Your future matters.





# MENTORSHIP PROGRAM



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Our Mentorship Program connects junior and senior secondary school students with professionals from diverse fields. Through interactive classroom sessions, students gain exposure to real-world experiences, career insights, and life skills that go beyond the school curriculum.

In a system where students often lack access to practical guidance, this program helps them understand the steps needed to reach their goals. Mentors share personal stories, answer questions, and offer clarity on subjects like career paths, decision-making, and personal growth.

To date, over 10,000 students have benefited from this initiative, many leaving inspired, informed, and better equipped to make meaningful choices about their future.

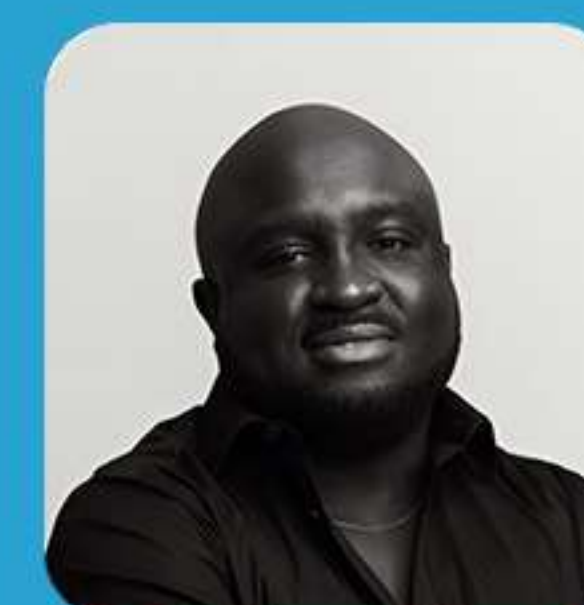
